## Offsetting our carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>)

## What is carbon offsetting?

They're deliberate coping schemes aimed at making up for an activity carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) emissions by reducing emissions elsewhere (for example through reforestation projects).

Offsetting CO<sub>2</sub> emissions is a necessary but not sufficient measure to achieve carbon neutrality and must be planned later than reducing one's emissions.

The promoted environmental projects must have a clear and transparent social outcome:



To preserve and restore natural assets.



To foster fruition by social capital.



To boost and promote relational capital.
