Forest Stewardship Council (FSC®): what it stands for?

FSC[®] label identifies products containing wood from forests fairly and reliably managed according to stringent environmental, social and economic standards. The original forest has been screened and rated according to these standards (principles and criteria of good forest management), set and approved by the Forest Stewardship Council[®] A.C. through stakeholder engagement and agreement.

Founded in 1993 by a small group of environmental associations, foremost Greenpeace and WWF, it has expanded over time to become an international NGO that is today inclusive of other environmental, social, and indigenous community groups, scientists and technicians, forest owners, and industries that process, transform, and trade wood.

In terms of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, FSC's core focus is on Goal 15.2 (progress toward sustainable forest management, halting deforestation, restoring degraded forests, and increasing reforestation and afforestation), namely:

- Present method and operational tools aimed at the sustainable management of forests and wood products
- Prove that consumer demand can be met by suppliers' and producers' range of products making a tangible contribution to the long-term maintenance of forest biodiversity and its fundamental ecological functions while benefiting local communities

FSC label lets companies certify of not being directly or indirectly involved in activities such as:

- illegal logging, illegal trade in timber or forest products
- breach of human and customary rights in forestry operations

- destruction of forests having high conservation value
- significant changeover of forests to plantations or non-forest use
- · introduction of genetically modified organisms

FSC label is divided into the following three certification levels:

- Forest Management, FM: to achieve this certification, an evaluation of all the methods by which the forest area is managed is essential. This entails analysis of both the early planning stages of forest activities and the operational aspects in the field, up to felling and extraction of timber and other products. The agreement of any local and national stakeholders is further required
- Controlled Wood, CW: to meet the growing demand for certified material, the FSC system admits a category of raw material which, although not certified, can give sufficient guarantees to companies and consumers in meeting a number of minimum criteria set by FSC. Thanks to Controlled Wood, more producers can thus help promoting FSC's mission and vision worldwide. Controlled Wood is the first step to achieve full Forest Management certification
- Chain of Custody, CoC: ensures traceability of materials sourced from FSC-certified forests: a key condition for making use of FSC logo on products

The main raw material for Fedrigoni is 100% FSC-labeled pulp, 97% being COC (the most demanding part of the FSC framework).
