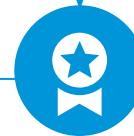
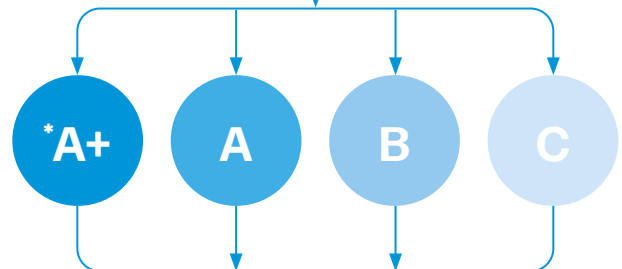
The Aticelca test



The Aticelca 501/19 system is a **voluntary assessment method** for measuring the **level of recyclability** of any paper and cardboard product through a lab simulation.

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Recyclability Levels



Should the product fall into one of these recyclability classes the company is authorized to use the **"Recyclable with Paper - Aticelca® 501"** label for commercial purposes.
